Papers written in English, which are accepted for presentation at the Seminar but not accepted for RME, will be published in the Proceedings of the Seminar.

Submission of Papers: The deadline of applying for a paper presentation at the International Sessions of Oral Delivery or the Poster Session is *December 15, 2009*.

The deadline for submission of full papers is *December 15, 2009*. All articles for RME will be submitted to two referees for blind reviewing before making the final decision.

The deadline for submission of the abstracts to the Poster Session is *December 15, 2009*. Abstracts of the posters will be published in the Proceedings of the Seminar.

If you submit the full article for the posters before *December 15, 2009*, they may appear in the special issues of RME if they are suitable for the journal articles. All articles for RME will be submitted to two referees for blind reviewing before making the final decision.
